

Reducing Energy Costs with Solar Power

Solar energy is a clean, renewable energy source. The Village of Hanover Park 2010 Comprehensive Plan embraces green technology, green building design, and sustainable energy. To encourage the installation of solar panels the Village was one of four Cook County communities to participate in the Solar Chicago Pilot Program in 2014.

In 2017 the Village was designated at a "Bronze" level from the national "SolSmart" program and also received technical advice on ways to remove regulatory barriers to the installation of Solar Energy Systems. The Village is working on updating our codes to make the installation of Solar Energy Systems easier by allowing these systems as an accessory use in all zoning districts and identifying the criteria/requirements for installation.

Typically, Solar Energy Systems are found in the form of solar panels, that are either mounted on the roof, or integrated with the building façade, awning, windows or walls. They can also be freestanding or mounted on the

roof of parking canopies. Panels are designed to absorb sunlight, and therefore do not produce glare. Homeowners can install systems to lower their energy costs.

Hanover Park is not alone in embracing solar energy. Illinois has been recognized as a national leader with the passage of the Future Energy Jobs Act (FEJA) which passed the Illinois General Assembly with broad bipartisan support in Dec. 2016. The law creates funding for a new clean energy policy. It sets a goal for 25% of the State's energy to come from renewable sources by 2025, provides job training funds for the solar workforce, and creates consumer and environmental benefits.

EDUCATION AND WORK CENTER

In Hanover Park

Elgin Community College, Harper College to offer career-technical classes at Education and Work Center this fall

Elgin Community College and Harper College will begin offering career and technical education courses at the Education and Work Center in Hanover Park this fall. Harper will offer a manufacturing generalist certificate and ECC will establish a series of computer and business classes.

Courses begin in August, and interested students can attend planned information sessions hosted by the center. Because the new offerings result in college credit, students will pay tuition and fees. Tuition assistance and/or financial aid may be available. Additional details regarding information sessions, tuition and registration will be announced soon.

The center will continue to offer its existing programs at no cost, including English as a second language (ESL), adult basic education and high school equivalency (HSE) classes. The Chicago-Cook Workforce Partnership and the on-site WorkNet® Center also provide career resources, workshops, training assistance, volunteer and job opportunities. Tactical Live Fire Training with our Neighbors

As part of an ongoing progressive training program, the Hanover Park Fire Department recently conducted its bi-annual live burn fire training. Twice each year, firefighters attend 3 days of live fire training in Huntley, IL hosted by the department's training division and chief officers. This year, Hanover Park had the privilege of inviting several members of the Streamwood Fire Department.

Streamwood Fire Department is one of the multiple fire departments that are dispatched at the same time when a request for a working structure fire is received in Hanover Park. Nearly all fire departments across the country attempt to utilize similar responses from neighboring jurisdictions. This is known as mutual aid. The annual live fire training allows each department to become familiar with vehicles, equipment, tactics, and decision making of each fire department before the actual emergency arrives. This training and interoperability defines our ability to limit loss of life and property damage.

Mutual aid training with live fire evolutions also fulfills requirements to maintain our high-quality ISO class 2 rating from the Insurance Services Office. Tips to Have a Fun and Safe Summer Season



It is time again to enjoy the outdoors with warm temperatures and mild afternoons. During this time, people find themselves more involved in outdoor life. As the temperatures get warmer and the grass begins to grow, grilling outside feels like a necessity.

With the upcoming holidays and being outdoors, the Fire Prevention Office would like to share a few fire safety tips to help you during the upcoming summer season.

According to the National Fire Protection Association and the Hanover Park Fire Department, here are some precautions to keep in mind when grilling outside:

- Propane and charcoal barbecue grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railing and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep the grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

With the Fourth of July quickly approaching, we want to remind everyone that in Illinois, ALL FIREWORKS are illegal unless authorized by local jurisdiction permits for supervised public displays.

The term fireworks does not include sparklers, smoke devices, snake and glow work pellets, or trick noisemakers. Please beware that even these seemingly harmless devices can be dangerous. Misuse of them by children can create tragic situations.


Fleet Services Manager Lowth
