Teen Dating Violence

We are living in a world where one in three students report experiencing some form of abuse, and more than 2/3 never report that abuse to a caring adult. 81% of parents surveyed either believe teen dating violence is not an issue or admit they don't know if it's an issue (Women's Health, 2004). February is National Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month; a good time to provide parents with information to help their adolescents navigate the confusing world of teen relationships.

Teenagers experience the same type of abuse as adults, but at an even greater frequency. Intimate partner violence is most common among women between the ages of 18-24 (Truman, J. & Morgan, R. - 2014). Teen dating violence is often hidden because teenagers are inexperienced with dating, want independence from parents and are vulnerable to peer pressure. Young men may equate masculinity with aggressiveness and may fear losing respect if they are seen as being attentive and supportive to their girlfriends. Young women may believe their boyfriend's jealousy, possessiveness and abuse is an indication that he cares.

Unhealthy relationships can start early and last a lifetime. Dating abuse can lead to unwanted pregnancy, eating disorders, depression, anxiety, and suicide. The goal is to stop teen dating violence before it starts. The preteen and teen years are an ideal time to promote healthy relationships and prevent patterns of dating violence that can last into adulthood. Parents can help by talking to their teens about what is "normal" dating behavior, teaching their teenagers the warning signs of violence, and letting them know that they have choices and deserve respect. Area Response Teams (ART)

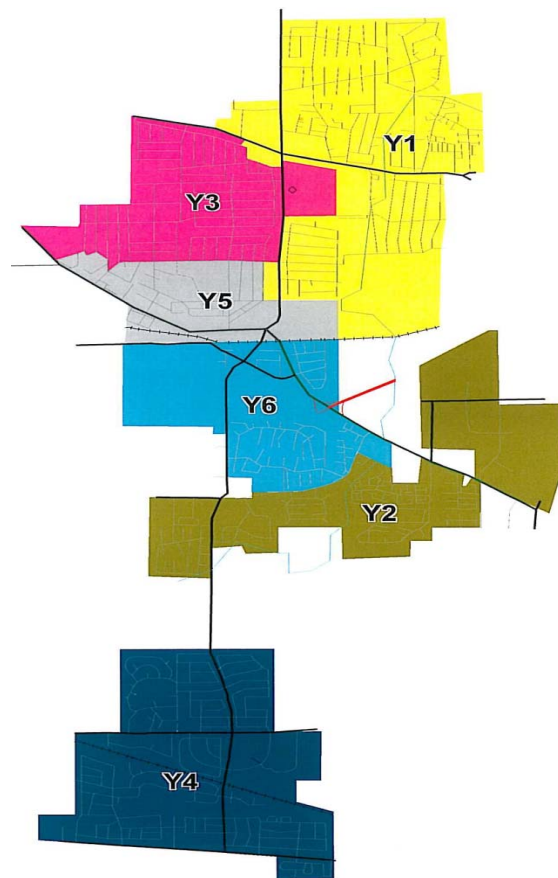

The HeartSaver/AED course is designed to teach CPR, the use of an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED), and what to do in the event of a choking emergency for victims of all ages. This course is designed for those that are expected to help in the event of an emergency in the workplace. This class is also highly recommended for new parents, babysitters, and anyone that wishes to help in the event of an emergency. This class follows the recommendations set by the American Heart Association.

This course is designed to teach the skills of CPR to victims of all ages (including ventilation with a protective barrier device, the use of an AED, the use of a bag valve mask, and foreign-body airway obstruction). This class is intended for HealthCare professionals that work both in and out of a hospital setting, EMT students, nursing school students, childcare/daycare facility employees and DCFS participants. This class meets the requirements set by the American Heart Association, and is required to maintain most Professional Medical Licenses.

WINTER START-UP TIPS



Always start the heating season with a new furnace filter
 Make certain the furnace flue pipe is connected properly
 Do not store anything that can burn around the furnace

Have the furnace cleaned and adjusted to help lower fuel costs



Vacuum the bathroom fan grill regularly to avoid dust build-up
 Never use the fan if it is making noise while running
 Avoid letting the fan run for extended time while unattended

Bathroom fans should be inspected and cleaned annually



Keep space heaters at least 3 feet from combustible materials
 Avoid using space heaters in sleeping areas
 Do not place heaters on chairs or other furniture
 Avoid using extension cords with space heaters
 Do not use electric heaters in bathrooms

Do not use kerosene or oil burning heaters indoors

Public Works

Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)

In 2014, the Forestry Division was very busy dealing with the effects of the EAB. Throughout the Village, 754 dead ash trees were removed, 1,500 parkway trees were trimmed and 251 new parkway trees were planted.



Looking forward to 2015, EAB affected tree work will continue with plans to have 750 dead ash removed in DuPage County. Additionally, 1,580 trees will be trimmed in the Greenbrook subdivision. At the end of 2015 the Village hopes to have all dead ash trees south of Lake Street removed, with the entire Village completed in 2016.

Due to the escalated removal schedule, all forestry funds will be spent on removal of the dead ash trees, and new planting will be suspended. If you have had a dead ash removed and would like to plant your own parkway tree, please contact the Public Works Department for an information packet to assist you at 630.823.5700.

Environmental Committee 2014 Accomplishments

The Environmental Committee accomplished the following this past year:

- Marked over 80 storm inlets with the “Dump No Waste – Drains to River” stencil.
- Participated in the 23rd Annual DuPage River Sweep. Committee members attended an “Adopt-a-Stream” program hosted by the Conservation Foundation. They designated a stretch of the West Branch of the DuPage River both upstream and downstream of the bridge near the intersection of Arlington and Greenbrook Boulevard as Hanover Park’s “Adopt-a-Stream” segment.
- Conducted the Sixth Annual Recycling Event with great success on September 27th, at the Com-lot. Approximately 800 people brought goods.
- Continued to recycle holiday lights. Bring your inoperative strings of holiday lights to the Public Works facility for recycling, rather than discarding them in the trash.

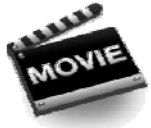
