Village Updates Building Codes

The mission of the Village is to provide responsive and effective municipal services toward the goal of maintaining a good quality of life for residents and businesses within the community.

As part of the Village of Hanover Park’s commitment to public safety, energy conservation and community appearance, the Board of Trustees has recently updated its building and related codes. Based upon the International Code Council® model building codes 2012 edition, the Village of Hanover Park has adopted the following with some local amendments:

- International Fire Code – 2012 Edition
- International Mechanical – 2012 Edition
- National Electric Code – 2011 Edition
- International Fuel Gas Code – 2012 Edition
- International Residential Code – 2012 Edition
- International Accessibility Code – 2012 Edition
- International Energy Conservation Code– 2012 Edition
- International Swimming Pool and Spa Code – 2012 Edition
- International Property Maintenance Code – 2012 Edition

**Codes required by the State of Illinois, such as the Illinois State Plumbing Code and NFPA 101, Life Safety Code remain in effect, as do all other existing municipal ordinances.*

Impact of Code Changes

- ◆ Keeps Hanover Park current with other communities
- ◆ Maintains a lower ISO rating for the Village (the lower the rating, the better for insurance rates!)
- ◆ Since current codes will be used, buildings will be safer and more energy efficient
- ◆ Plan reviews will be quicker since consultants will not have to research/review old codes
- ◆ Will make creation of building plans easier for architects and designers



Reminder to Pet Owners (Village Code 1963, Ord. No. 0-73-26)

Village Ordinance requires all cats and dogs be vaccinated against rabies by the age of four months and to display a Village license tag on a collar to be worn at all times. Tags can be purchased at the Municipal Center for \$5.00 each calendar year. Guide dogs, animals owned by residents age 65 or older are exempt. (Sec 14-47)

Dogs must be controlled at all times and may only be walked on a leash not exceeding eight feet in length. It is unlawful to walk your pet without possessing a device to immediately remove any excrement deposited by the animal on public or private property. Be respectful of the neighbors around you and monitor your dog or cat when outside. Do not allow them to howl, yelp, whine, meow, bark or make noise in such a manner as to disturb other citizens.



2015 Brush Pick Up Program

The Brush Pick Up Program provides free curbside pickup and chipping of branches, which are then reused as mulch. Last year, the program produced mulch, which was made available free to Village residents for use around shrubs and flower beds. Brush will be picked up in April, July, and October. See schedule below.



What will be picked up: Branches with a minimum of two (2) feet in length and a maximum of ten (10) feet in length and less than eight (8) inches in diameter.

What will not be picked up: Small hedge or pine clippings; Yard waste or brush in containers; Brush or branches with thorns; Stumps or tree roots.

How to stack brush: Neatly stack the brush in one direction with the butt end toward the street; No lumber, wire, rope or other material may be included with the brush; Do not block the sidewalk when putting brush out.

Set Out Time: Brush can only be set out two days prior to 7:00 a.m. of your scheduled pick up period. Do not put brush out after 7:00 a.m. on the first day of the collection cycle. Hold it for the next scheduled pick up. The Village incurs considerable cost returning to an area to collect brush set out after the first day of the collection cycle.

Wood chip mulch is available for pick up or delivery. If interested, please contact Public Works at 630.823.5700 for further information or request a delivery.

Curbside yard waste collection is provided by Allied Waste Services once a week on Fridays beginning April 3, 2015 through November 28, 2015.

Yard waste stickers are required for curbside pickup, and yard waste must be placed in Kraft paper bags or branches must be tied in bundles up to 48 inches long and up to 18 inches in diameter. Stickers are available at the Village Hall.

Help protect your drinking water supply

Did you know that improper plumbing in your home or business can help create conditions where the water in your home, or even the public water supply, can become contaminated during certain situations? The improper plumbing that we will be discussing here is called a cross connection, and it occurs when improper plumbing could allow contaminated water to be drawn back into the water supply during conditions such as a water main break, firefighting, or if the water supply in your house is turned off.



Some cross connections are in-ground lawn sprinkler systems or swimming pools constructed without a back flow preventer. Other cross connections may be as simple as a garden hose submerged in a bucket of water, when soap, insecticide or weed killer is being mixed, if the hose faucet does not have an anti-siphon feature built in.

All cross-connection contamination can be prevented by installing the proper backflow, atmospheric or anti-siphon devices on your plumbing. Hanover Park’s plumbing codes address where and what type of device is required for each situation depending on the degree of hazard that exists.

To help protect the Village’s water supply, the Public Works Department will be asking you to complete a survey of your home plumbing. Please watch for this survey with your water bill.

Public Works

Annual Spring Hydrant Flushing

Beginning **Monday, May 4th** and continuing through **Friday, May 15th**, the Village Water Division will be flushing hydrants throughout the Village. Flushing will occur between 6:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Signs will be posted in designated areas prior to flushing.

Residents should not wash laundry during the flushing hours, as rust staining of clothing may result. Residents with water softeners are encouraged to check the cycle time of their softeners so that the unit does not regenerate during this period.

Hydrants will be flushed by area according to the following schedule:

Cook County

May 4, 5, 6 - South of Irving Park Road, north of Lake Street, west of Barrington Road

May 7, 8 - South of Irving Park Road east of Barrington Road (Hanover Highlands and Longmeadow South area)

May 11, 12, 13, 14 - North of Irving Park Road



DuPage County

May 4, 5, 6, 7 - South of DuPage County Line, North of Stearns Road

May 8, 12 - South of Stearns Road, North of Schick Road

May 12, 13, 14, 15 - South of Schick Road

Children of Veterans' U of I Tuition Waiver

The University of Illinois will award one tuition waiver per identified military conflict selected by the General Assembly for each of the 102 counties for the children of veterans of specified conflicts. Applications were available starting December 1, 2014. Priority is given to applications received by March 1, 2015, and applicants will be notified by April 1, 2015. Application process for un-awarded conflicts closes October 1, 2015.

A candidate must be a permanent resident of the Illinois County from which he/she applies. The tuition waiver covers four consecutive years of in-state tuition (for undergraduate, graduate, or professional studies) at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, Chicago, Health Sciences Center, or Springfield Campus.
