RAIN BARRELS

The Village of Hanover Park and The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago are teaming up to offer **FREE** rain barrels. Orders will be accepted through mid-December, 2016.

Rain barrels are large containers that capture rainwater at the end of a downspout, and store the water for later use, for example in watering plants. Using water from rain barrels lowers water bills, helps reduce flooding, and can have a dramatic impact on water quality in our rivers & streams.

The 55-gallon barrels are made from reused plastic and come equipped with a spigot, a screw-off lid, a garden hose threaded overflow, and screen in the top to help keep out mosquitos and debris. Pick up your application at the front counter at Village Hall, or visit our website at www.hpil.org



Are You Prepared for An Emergency?

If an emergency occurred tomorrow, would you be ready? September is National Preparedness Month. Sponsored by FEMA, National Preparedness Month aims to educate and empower families to prepare for and respond to all types of emergencies. I know what you might be thinking...“Nothing bad is going to happen in Hanover Park.” The truth is emergencies can happen in a community of any size. It doesn’t have to be something as huge as a terrorist attack or a tsunami; things like heavy rains or a power outage can negatively impact a community for days at a time.

The most important step you can take in helping your community is making sure you can take care of yourself for a short period of time after an incident. The Police and Fire Departments may not be able to reach your family right away when they are trying to deal with a major incident so be sure to prepare a disaster supply kit with at least three days of food and water. During a disaster, it is common for phone and internet connections to be unreliable. Create a family emergency plan so your family knows how to find one another and communicate. There are many more practical tips for preparing for a disaster and creating an emergency communications plan online at www.ready.gov .

Now is the time to talk about being ready and preparing for the unexpected. Let your friends and family know that you are prepared for an emergency and encourage them to create their own preparedness plans. Get the kids involved with creating and practicing your plan. It can be comforting to know that you are not helpless in the face of an emergency. A disaster can take a toll on a community, but the more people who are prepared, the quicker the community will recover.

FIRE SAFETY REMINDER - CLEAN VENTS PREVENT FIRES

One of the most common causes of fires that Hanover Park Firefighters respond to are those caused by buildup of dust and lint inside dryer vent pipes and bathroom vent fans. These hazards can easily be reduced by simply inspecting and cleaning these systems on a regular basis.

Clothes Dryer Vent Pipe

The clothes dryer vent pipe is a connection from your dryer to the outside of your house. After using the dryer, some of the lint from clothes can get trapped in this vent pipe and can stop the release of hot air from inside the dryer. This will cause the dryer and clothes to overheat and possibly start the clothes on fire inside the dryer or the lint in the vent pipe. This hazard can easily be reduced by removing the vent pipe from the dryer and either vacuuming the inside of the pipe, taking it outside and washing it out with a garden hose or blowing it out with a leaf blower. You should be able to see from one end of the pipe to the other making sure all interior surfaces are clean. If you are unable to get the pipe cleaned, it should be replaced.

Buildup in Bathroom Exhaust Fans

These fans after time can build up dust and dirt on the fan blades and cause the fan to slow down. This will cause the motor to heat up, stop turning and start on fire. Fans can easily be cleaned by removing the cover and vacuuming the fan blades and surrounding area.

The Fire Department recommends cleaning both of these vent systems bi-annually. A good reminder is to clean these units at the same time you replace your smoke detector and CO monitor batteries.

Trick or Treat Hours

The Village of Hanover Park wishes everyone a safe and happy Halloween. Trick or treat hours on Monday, October 31 are from 3:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. Dial 9-1-1 if any suspicious activity is observed.

A few safety reminders:

- Make sure children’s costumes are bright and reflective and consider adding reflective tape to bags or costumes if necessary.
- Remind children how to call 9-1-1 in the event of an emergency or if they become lost.
- Children should always use sidewalks if available and cross the street in crosswalks. Never cross between parked cars.
- If older children are trick or treating without a parent or guardian, plan a specific route and return time.
- Children should never enter a home of a stranger to accept candy.
- Parents or a responsible adult should examine all treats and throw away any unwrapped or spoiled items.

Remove Dead Trees Before They Fall

The Village has concluded its efforts to remove all of the dead and dying Ash Trees from the Village parkways. However, there are many more Ash trees in the Village that are a current and future threat to people and property. It is very important that dead trees be cut down. All dead trees will eventually fall. It may take years, but depending on the circumstance, it could happen immediately.

A healthy tree will generally not fall unless acted upon by some outside force. Dead trees begin to decay almost immediately and that decay can start at the bottom. If that is the case, a tree that appears otherwise solid may have a hollow trunk with all the weight of the tree having less and less support as time goes by. Not only does this increase the likelihood of the entire tree falling, but it also gives you no control over where it falls. It could be your house, car, or even on a person or pet.

Dead trees are also subject to infestations. Termites, beetles, and other wood boring pests like to make their nests in dead trees. Unfortunately, this also makes your home vulnerable as your home is often within the insects traveling distance.

It is important that you use proper safety precautions when taking down a dead tree. In most cases this will mean contracting with a bonded and insured tree care company that has experience in taking down dead trees. Large trees, especially if they overhang homes or other property, can be quite complicated to remove and this should be performed by professionals. An experienced contractor can make sure that the tree is removed without damaging your property or your neighbors. Generally there are enough contractors in the area that you can get multiple quotes to make sure you're getting the right contractor for your job. Removing a tree by yourself can be very dangerous and should only be undertaken if you have the skill, experience, and tools to do the job safely.

Tree Planting

In 2015, the Village announced that all Village owned Ash Trees designated for removal were removed. The Village Board authorized \$180,000 for tree planting in 2016, as it is important that we create a diverse urban forest to limit the impact that any future blight would have on the whole of the Village. Approximately 300 trees were planted in the spring and another 300 trees will be planted this fall. If your parkway tree was removed as part of the Emerald Ash Borer removal program, and you are concerned about when it will be replaced, please call the Public Works Department at 630.823.5700.



No Yard Waste Sticker Required For Leaf Collection in November



As a benefit to the residents of Hanover Park, leaf collection in November will not require a yard waste sticker to be collected by Republic Services/Allied Waste. This is during the month of **NOVEMBER ONLY**. Leaf collection in all other months will occur as it has previously. All you have to do is rake your leaves, put them into a recyclable yard waste bag, and set them at the curb on your normal trash pickup day. Sanitary Sewer Line Warranty

The Village of Hanover Park has partnered with Service Line Warranties of America, through the National League of Cities, to offer the residents of Hanover Park a sanitary sewer line warranty program. The homeowners are responsible for the maintenance and repair of the sewer service line from their home, all the way to the main, including the connection. If a repair is needed, it can be several thousand dollars. This program will cover up to \$4,000 per incident, plus an additional \$4,000 if the public street needs to be cut for the repair. Please watch your mailbox for information regarding this program.



Water Seeping Into Your Basement?

One common cause of water entering basements is water being directed towards the foundation of a house. Small amounts of standing water can seep through cracks in the walls, and significant amounts can overload window well drains and enter through windows. In order to keep this from happening, downspouts and sump pumps should be directed away and, preferably, downhill from the house. In addition, you need to make sure the slope around the house is not working against you. Over time, patios, walkways, and the ground can move and settle, sometimes causing water to flow back towards the house. Changes can be subtle, so take note of standing water near the foundation after a heavier rain event.

Listen to your sump pump for clues. If your sump pump goes off every few minutes when the weather does not seem to warrant it, water may be directed towards the foundation and being recycled into your sump pump pit. If you would like help with an assessment of your drainage, or suggestions for what to do, please call our Village Engineer, Karen Daulton Lange, at 630.823.5650 to make an appointment. Sometimes little changes can make a big impact, so take a look around your house today!

8th Annual Household Recycling Event

- Bicycles, wheel chairs and crutches (must be in working, usable condition) American flags
- Personal documents for shredding (provided by Iron Mountain) no businesses, hard covers, binders, binder clips, or books (limit 3)
- Motor oil and antifreeze
- Eye glasses, hearing aids, keys
- Scrap metal
- Large lead-acid batteries (auto, sump pump, SLA, marine batteries)
- Household batteries
- Cell phones and ink-jet cartridges
- CFL and fluorescent bulbs
- Clean, usable child and adult clothing
- Fire extinguishers

The Village's final brush pick-up will take place during the month of October in accordance with the following schedule:

Area 1 & 2 (Streets North of Lake Street) **October 3rd**
 Area 3 & 4 (Streets South of Lake St.) **October 17th**

All branches must be out by 7:00 a.m. on the first day of pickup for your area.

If you miss your scheduled pickup, you may put brush and branches out for pickup by Allied Waste services on Friday's through December 2, 2016.

Wood chips, which are a by-product of the Brush Pick Up program, are available for pick up or delivery. If interested, please contact Public Works at 630.823.5700 for further information or to request a delivery.



Finance Department Update - Water & Sewer Monthly Billing Begins

Starting **September 1, 2016**, all water and sewer bills (Cook and DuPage Counties) will be billed **monthly** and due on the **21st** of each month. For timely bill processing be sure to include your Account Number with your payment.



Please note that failure to receive a bill does not excuse penalty charges.

A **Termination Notice** will be issued after the 21st of the month. Full payment must be received by the Water Department by the end of the business day, no later than 4:30 p.m., on the due date listed on the Termination Notice.

After the 34th day of billing a **\$50.00 fee** will be added and the water will be **shut-off** without further notice. **Payment of ALL account balances will be required prior to restoring service.** Payments received **after 3:00 p.m.** may result in **up to 24 hours to have the service reinstated.**

There must be someone **age 18 or older** in the residence for water to be turned on or a waiver must be signed by the owner.



VEHICLES ARE TO BE BROUGHT INTO THE VENDOR AREA FOR LOADING AND UNLOADING OF MERCHANDISE ONLY. NO VEHICLES ARE PERMITTED IN VENDOR AREA DURING MAXWELL STREET HOURS AFTER 9 AM

The Village reserves the right to restrict and prohibit the type of merchandise that can be sold from the Village's commuter parking lot. There will be **NO** sales of live animals, illegal products, weapons of any kind, sexually-oriented products, or other material that in the sole discretion of the Village is deemed inappropriate for this event.

*FOOD VENDORS: Only pre-packaged food items will be permitted. No preparation or sampling of food products is allowed. Products must be room temperature stable. Products must be purchased from an approved source. Products must be in manufacturer packaging with complete ingredient labels. All products must be within the manufacture sell by/use by dates. Products must be displayed and stored in a manner that prevents contamination. All food items for sale at the event must be listed and pre-approved by the Village Health Officer. Applications for food vendors must be submitted a week prior to the event. Certificate of Insurance must be attached to your application with the following information: The Special Event: Hanover Park Maxwell Street Metra @ the Market must be named in the Certificate of Insurance and include the dates of the event; The Village of Hanover Park must be listed as a certificate holder and additional insured.; and Commercial General Liability: \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate.

Village of Hanover Park Sister's Cities Committee Wins 2016 Best Overall Program Award

The Village of Hanover Park's Sister Cities Committee has been awarded the Sister Cities International's 2016 Best Overall Program Award. This Award recognizes a Sister City program that demonstrated outstanding accomplishments in 2015. The Village began their Sister Cities with Cape Coast, Ghana in 1991 and Valparaiso, Zacatecas, Mexico in 2010.

The Village of Hanover Park Sister Cities Committee demonstrated their excellence to earn this award in 2015 by engaging the Lions Clubs to donate funds to the Cape Coast Lions Club and the



Hearing Assessment Clinic at the Cape Coast School for the Deaf. The committee facilitated the painting, shutter replacement, and the roof repair of the Hanover Park Primary School in Cape Coast. The committee also donated funds to the Jesus Gonzales Ortega School in Valparaiso for school supplies, educational materials, donated soccer uniforms and game balls. The Sister Cities Committee donated funds for the construction of a permanent canopy at the outdoor seating area for the Domestic Violence Prevention Unit at the Regional Police Headquarters in Cape Coast. To further support interaction with Cape Coast and Valparaiso, the committee supports the annual Zacatecanos Festival and Ghanafest which are popular local events.

Locally, the committee worked with Girl Scouts by teaching at their International Night and collecting reading books for schools in Cape Coast and Valparaiso. They exhibited indigenous crafts from central Mexico and coastal Ghana at "Art Appreciation Around the World" at the Poplar Creek Library and hosted a Black History Month event featuring West African food, art, and culture. The committee also participated in the "Kids at Hope" resource fair in an effort to encourage schools to participate in Sister City programs.

The Village of Hanover Park Sister Cities Committee was honored at the Lou Wozar Diplomatic Awards Dinner on Saturday, July 16th, during Sister Cities International 60th Anniversary Celebration in Washington, DC.
