First Responder Research Saves Lives



For the past 18 months, Skidmore College's First Responder research team has partnered with the Hanover Park Fire Department, US Army Institute of Environmental Medicine, University of Illinois Fire Service Institute and UCLA on a \$1.5 million FEMA grant project. As part of the project, all Hanover Park firefighters wore wireless, wearable technologies to sense, track and relay individual physiologic responses during each 24-hour shift.

A recognized fire service leader, Hanover Park not only sent its data to Skidmore for ongoing analysis, but also has been able to observe and monitor information during incidents.

During a wildland brush fire last February, one firefighter was found to have an excessively high core temperature. The temperature had risen to an alarming 103°. 104° is the diagnostic level for heat stroke and a 105° is associated with the beginning of brain-cell damage.

"This was the first time our department has ever been able to track firefighter's physiologic responses in real time," says Chief Haigh. "And perhaps one of the first times anywhere."

Dr. Denise Smith, Director of Skidmore's First Responder Lab said "The HPFD was able to see the thermal strain in real time, and a firefighter was subsequently sent to rehabilitation (rest, recovery, medical monitoring).

Based on the event data and Chief Haigh's extensive experience, he again began exploring his long-held idea of using different gear for non-structural fire incidents. "We discussed his findings and developing hypothesis and agreed to do a follow-up study to investigate the use of lighter gear" says Smith.

In June, three HPFD firefighters traveled to Skidmore to participate in tests in the college's first responder lab. The testing conducted in the labs environmental chamber looked at a comparison of traditional structural gear to a new hybrid non-structural gear. They were joined by several members of New York departments.

Smith and Haigh have collaborated on research on fire and health safety issues for the past 20 years. "This latest project is a pilot study and the data has not been fully analyzed. However, there is emerging evidence suggesting that lighter-weight gear can reduce thermal strain," Smith says.

Based on the preponderance of evidence, Haigh has requested \$111,000 from FEMA as part of a grant to equip Hanover Park firefighters with hybrid gear. This gear will be worn for calls not requiring thermal protection such as vehicle accidents, alarm investigations and some medical calls, as well as wildland fires, which account for 87% of the department's total call volume. Haigh believes this change will reduce injuries and illnesses. He is hopeful that FEMA will agree to fund the grant request.

- I stay in a group and if a parent isn't with us, they know the route we will follow
- I never enter a stranger's home or car for a treat

- I use make-up instead of a mask, or at least I take my mask off between houses

- My child's costume is bright, reflective and made of flame retardent material
- My child's costume fits well and does not drag

- I know the route they are going and it is in a well-known and well-lit area
- My child had a good meal before trick or treating
- My child knows not to eat anything before I check it
- My child knows his or her address and telephone number and how to reach me
- My child knows the difference between pranks and vandalism

Big Water Needed to Stop Today's Fires

With more and more modern products manufactured using plastics, synthetics and laminates, the required flow rates to control fires has dramatically increased. Fire Chief Craig A. Haigh says, "these type products, produced as derivatives of oil, have become a game changer on how we approach fires." Legacy materials such as wood, paper and cotton generate about half of the heat that is produced by the more modern materials. This change causes fires to move more rapidly through structures, requires greater flow rates to absorb the temperatures being produced and makes fighting the fires much more dangerous for firefighters. To address this new reality, departments are placing greater emphasis on the use of heavy caliber streams.

In August of this year, the Hanover Park Fire Department and the Carol Stream Fire Protection District came together to work on techniques required to deliver heavy caliber flows. Using a vacant Carol Stream warehouse scheduled for demolition, the departments were able to train on use of their Tower Ladders to apply large water flows inside structures as an offensive operational tactic. Rarely do departments get the opportunity to conduct this type of training using an existing structure. Since both departments regularly respond to emergency incidents together, this was a unique opportunity to enhance the skills of both agencies firefighters and officers.
