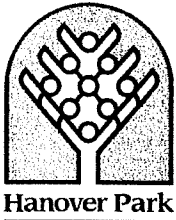

Dear Mr. Swanson:

Since the Village of Hanover Park is a cooperating permit holder for the above referenced permit, we have elected to file our annual report jointly with DuPage County. Therefore in addition to DuPage County's documented efforts, which will be an integral part of the annual report, the Village of Hanover Park accomplished the following:

B. STATUS OF COMPLIANCE

BMP No. A.3

A short video entitled "Don't Muddy the Waters" continues on the local access channel on cable TV, running every few minutes.

BMP No. A.4

The Hanover Park Environmental committee, which was formed in 2008, continues to meet on a monthly basis. The committee completed 90 "No Dumping-Drains to River" stencils on Village owned stormwater inlets and catch basins. The committee also sponsored a recycling event in September 18, 2010, collecting approximately 350 gallons of oil and antifreeze. The Environmental committee also solicited volunteers and participated in the DuPage River sweep (5/10) providing cleanup activities along the West Branch of the DuPage River south of Lake St.

BMP No. A.5

Village Engineer Bill Beckman attended a four day course (11/10) taught by FEMA on Floodplain regulations. Village Engineer Bill Beckman and Engineering

Technician Richard Fortier attended a half day seminar entitled "NPDES Inspections from the Inspector's Perspective" at DuPage County (4/11). Village Engineer Bill Beckman, Engineering Technician Roger Boelter and Engineering Technician Richard Fortier attended a half day ADS Showcase (11/10) which featured hands on demonstrations and technical seminars on stormwater quality products. Public Works Director Howard Killian attended seminars on StormCeptor (4/10) and sanitary sewer I&I reduction (9/10). Street Dept. Supervisor Scott Weber attended a seminar on chloride reduction in winter salting operations (9/10).

BMP NO. B.3

Village Engineer Bill Beckman attended the DuPage County monthly engineer's meetings regarding stormwater issues on the following dates:

BMP No. C.1

The Village of Hanover Park's storm sewer maps were updated in both the digital and hard copy forms in December 2010.

BMP No. E.2/E.4

Construction of water quality BMP's were incorporated into two separate building and parking lot expansion projects in the Turnberry Lakes Business Park.

BMP No. F.2

283 catch basins were cleaned utilizing the Public Works vacuum machine, and 41,775 lineal feet of storm sewer pipe was cleaned utilizing the Public Works jetting machine. 20 catch basins were repaired or replaced. 79.5 miles of Village streets were swept on 15 occasions (Once per month March-September and once per week in October and November). An existing wet bottom detention pond on Morton Rd. was retrofitted with a restrictor designed to reduce downstream flooding and enhance

water quality in the pond. A new salt storage dome was constructed, incorporating more efficient techniques for road salt handling. Finally road salt usage per mile was reduced by 30% in comparison to the previous five year average using a natural solution known as Geomelt and utilizing pre-application techniques.

D. PLANNED ACTIVITIES

The Village is cooperating with the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, which has regional jurisdiction for stormwater management in the Cook County portion of the Village, in its efforts to implement a Watershed Management Ordinance for Cook County.

E. CO-PERMITTEE OBLIGATIONS

This will certify that the Village of Hanover Park, as co-permittee with DuPage County, is relying on DuPage County to satisfy some of the permit obligations.

F. CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

A new Police Station building is currently under construction at the Village's Municipal complex on Lake St., providing additional stormwater detention and water quality measures. Additional storm sewer on Berkshire Dr. was constructed as part of the Village's annual Sewer & Water Improvement program. Engineering is underway for the replacement of the Longmeadow Ln. bridge over the West Branch of the DuPage river.

It is our understanding that the above information will be submitted by DuPage County as part of the annual report to IEPA, and as such fulfills the Village of Hanover Park's reporting requirements. Please contact me at 630-372-4271 if additional information is needed.
