Save Money! Free Payment Options For Village Services

The Village of Hanover Park wants to remind residents that it provides FREE payment options that do not incur additional credit and debit card processing fees:

- Paper Checks – can be mailed to the address on the invoice or deposited into various drop boxes at the Village Hall.
- Auto-Draft – (for water bill payments only) – is a convenient monthly withdrawal from a bank account that automatically pays your water bill, so it's never late. You continue receiving water bills, so you can monitor water use and will always know exactly how much will be transferred.
- E-Lock Box – Online bill pay through customer's bank
- Cash, Check, Money Order and Cashier's Check – payment is accepted at all payment counters (Village Hall)

Beginning January 1st, 2019, a 2.75% processing fee is being added to credit and debit card payments with a minimum fee of \$1.00 for each transaction. This fee will apply to all payments made for credit or debit card payments for accounts with Visa, Mastercard, and Discover. These fees are paid directly to the credit and debit card companies and are not collected by the Village.

For example, on a \$50 payment, a processing fee of \$1.38 ($\$50 \times 2.75\% = \1.38) will appear on your statement. Another example, a \$35 payment, a processing fee of \$1.00 ($\$35 \times 2.75\% = \0.96 - minimum fee of \$1.00) will appear on your statement.

These fees do not apply to daily parking payments in the commuter parking lot (METRA Station).

Credit Cards Accepted: Discover, MasterCard, Visa



Effective January 1, 2019 a service fee of 2.75% with a minimum of \$1.00 will be applied to the total charge. All service fees charged on debit/credit transactions are retained by the payment processing company and will show as "AMS Service Fee" on your cardholder statement.

All service fees are non-refundable.

The Village of Hanover Park, IL does not charge or retain any of these fees.



Village Board Adopts 2019 Annual Budget

On December 6, 2018, the Village Board approved the Fiscal Year 2019 Annual Budget, which establishes authorized expenditures and sources of revenues from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019.

For the third year in a row, the Budget has been approved with a zero percent (0%) property tax increase, no water and sewer rate increase (fourth year in a row) and continues to maintain the high level of Village services that residents have come to expect. Despite continued economic challenges, the Village enters FY2019 on solid financial footing.

The General Assembly approved the state budget that partially restores the 10% cut to the Local Government Distribution Fund (LGDF) adopted in the State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2017-2018 budget. In the SFY 2018 – 2019 Budget, LGDF distributions are reduced by 5%. The budget also reduces the administrative fee on locally imposed sales taxes from 2% to 1.5%. While this may be an improvement for local government revenues, the reduced rate still far outweighs the actual cost incurred by the state to administer the collection of locally imposed sales taxes and needs to be further reduced.


Based on information from the Illinois Department of Revenue (IDOR), the actual percentage needed to cover costs of the collection is closer to 0.5%.

This budget document is in response to the needs of the citizens and business community of Hanover Park, and is designed to provide a comprehensive overview of the Village's financial activities during the next twelve months. It is a balanced budget that meets the Village's fund balance policies, and all current levels of service are well maintained. The Fiscal Year 2019 budget also reflects the Village's efforts to diversify revenues.

The total Village Budget expenditures for Fiscal Year 2019 equals \$65,116,886 and the total Village Budget revenues equal \$65,366,416. General Fund Fiscal Year 2019 expenditures total \$36,691,294 and the General Fund revenues total \$34,637,272. It should be noted that the expenditure excess of revenues for General Fund is planned use of unassigned fund balance, a transfer to fund Road and Bridge 2019 street reconstruction program and transfer to Central Equipment to purchase Asphalt paver, roller and trailer for street maintenance.

Village Hall Remodel Completion



Set your tree out on the above dates. This service will be provided to the homeowners associations not regularly serviced by Groot. 2018 Development Year in Review

Welcome to 2019! Here is a look back at some of the economic development and planning accomplishments in 2018:

- We are ending a great year by winning the 2018 Governor's Hometown Award for Habitat for Humanity's Neighborhood Revitalization project. The Village has been working hand-in-hand with Habitat, which will be building 27 new townhomes at Greenbrook Ct.
- Streetscape improvements have been initiated in the Village Center for our future downtown – around the Metra train station. These will include burial of overhead wires, landscaping, benches, and elements of pedestrian comfort and beautification.
- The Village continued to coordinate with the Tollway and IDOT to extend the Elgin O'Hare Expressway (IL 390), which will help develop our future downtown.
- Hanover Park earned the Gold Designation & Special Recognition Award from the SolSmart program by making it faster, easier, and more affordable for homes and businesses to go solar. Call us if you are interested in installing solar panels!
- The new Verandah senior housing developing, located at 900 Irving Park Road, is under construction! A model unit is complete if you'd like to check it out with an appointment. Once complete, the development will have 215 units, with an 'age in place' concept with townhomes, condos, assisted living and memory care, and onsite amenities.
- New Cricket Fields and a soccer field are coming soon at HP Sports Complex at Irving Park Road and Barrington.
- Hanover Park became home to not only several large employers like Prinova, RIM Logistics, Nefab and ER2 Image Group, but also many mom-and-pop businesses. - Held several events for business retention, recruitment and growth, including the Third Annual Small Business Forum, Local Business Expo, and Business After Hours.

Fire Department Rolls Out New Ambulance

This past fall, the Hanover Park Fire Department purchased and placed into service a new state of the art ambulance, replacing a unit which was 15 years old. The new ambulance resides at 6850 Barrington Road.

The new ambulance, a 2018 Ford F450 with a Horton 623 ambulance configuration, is equipped with the latest advanced life support equipment and technology and a highly-trained transport team to ensure the highest skill and quality of care treating the public. New Medic 15 was specified by the Hanover Park Fire Department through an inclusive design process with patient and crew safety in mind. Medic 15 is equipped with a 'power load' stretcher system, which eliminates physically lifting the stretcher to load it into the ambulance, helping to reduce the potential for back injuries. Monitoring equipment includes the Physio Control LifePak 15 heart monitor/defibrillator, allowing the crew to monitor the heart rhythm, provide electrical defibrillation, and monitor airway gases such as oxygen and carbon dioxide. Along with carrying advanced life support equipment, the exterior compartments are used by the crew to safely store their structural firefighting gear and tools.



The new ambulance will ensure that the Hanover Park Fire Department will continue to respond rapidly with the highest level of care in order to aid residents and visitors in their time of need.

Hidden Treasure

A surplus Public Works Water Division utility vehicle has found new life in a small southern Illinois volunteer fire department. The Village of Hanover Park recently replaced a 2004 utility truck with an updated and modern vehicle that better fits the needs of our community. Like all surplus vehicles, the old unit was slated for sale.



The Village of Omaha (IL) Fire Department was in dire need of a utility vehicle that could be used to provide first responder medical services to their small community. Hanover Park's Fire Chief, Craig A. Haigh learned of the department's need and wondered if the old Public Work's truck could meet their requirements. After numerous emails, exchange of photos, and a six plus hour drive to Hanover Park by Omaha's Fire Department Command Staff to look at the vehicle, the department determined that the truck was exactly what they needed.

Once fully equipped, the truck is expected to make around 75 emergency responses per year and will be a true asset for this small, all volunteer, fire department. Chief Haigh stated that he is pleased that he was able to coordinate this sale and that Hanover Park is in a position to help another emergency service organization better serve its community.

Upcoming CPR Courses for 2019



The Hanover Park Fire Department recognizes the importance of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). The instruction of non-Fire Department personnel increases both awareness and readiness within the community. This readiness plays a vital role in the chain of survival for heart attack victims.

The purpose of the CPR certification program is to provide effective CPR education at the lowest possible cost for the residents of the Hanover Park area; the program is instructed in accordance with current American Heart Association guidelines.

The Hanover Park Fire Department offers "Heartsaver" certification and recertification classes to the public and the Healthcare Provider instruction to those in the community which need certification for their employment.

Both Heartsaver and Healthcare Provider classes last approximately three hours. Participants obtain their certification cards immediately after completion of the course.

2019 Area Response Team (ART) Meetings

The Hanover Park Police Department is working to strengthen community relations to improve policing. This strategy is called Area Response Teams (ART).

ART involves assigning officers as area representatives for one year periods. Each area also has an assigned supervisor who is responsible for the crime that occurs and the officers assigned to the respective area.

Each area has a total of four officers assigned. Two officers for the day shift and two officers for the night shift. Residents are encouraged to call your Area Officers with any problems or concerns occurring in your neighborhood. This does not replace the 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System. If you have an emergency, please dial 9-1-1.

Residents also have the opportunity to meet with their area officers quarterly throughout the year. This year the meeting dates and times have changed slightly. Meetings for ART areas 3 and 5 will be combined, as will the meetings for ART areas 2 and 6. The majority of the ART meetings take place at the Hanover Park Police Headquarters in the Community Room which is located at 2011 Lake Street. At least one meeting for each area is held out in the community, usually the July meetings. The times and locations are always posted in advance on the Hanover Park Police Facebook page.

Remember, community policing means all of us working together to improve your neighborhood. Come join us!
