

MINUTE WITH THE MAYOR



Spring has sprung and that means the start of our always busy event season for the Village of Hanover Park. Do you want to see a movie? We have Movies in the Park. Listen to music? Wednesday Night Live! concerts at the Pavilion. Interactive Fun for Kids? Touch a Truck. Serve the Community? MLK Build-Up Day...and more things to do including our new Juneteenth Celebration at Ontarioville Plaza with live music, food trucks, face-painting and more! This issue is packed with events for the whole family, and it does not slow down as we move into the summertime.

I was proud to attend and host the return of my annual Kids at Hope: Hanover Park Health and Resource Fair that provides needed family services and safe, fun activities for youth in our community. Thank you to Police Department Social Worker Tricia Rossi for her many years in coordinating the event, as well as the rest of the Kids at Hope Committee! The turnout was tremendous and the resources available to families was inspiring. We are blessed in Hanover Park, a caring and supportive community.

I would like to thank Chief Menough for his service and dedication to the Village and I wish him well in his retirement. I welcome Chief Johnson in his new role as Police Chief, who will continue the department's legacy of being a highly trained, professional, and community-oriented police department.

It is always good to collaborate with our area elected officials and improve our community. I would like to thank all of our local township boards and supervisors for their assistance with helping the Village administer the water infrastructure fee discount for our eligible residents. The townships showed they are here to help our residents!

You may have noticed the work being done at the Hanover Park Sports Complex baseball fields. I would like to thank State Representative Fred Crespo for his assistance with funding for this project and supporting our youth.

It has been a busy legislative year and I, along with other Mayor's across the state, have been working to restore our Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF). LGDF supports core Village services and helps keep local taxes low. Unfortunately, the bill to restore 2% of the LGDF failed and the restoration amounted only to a 0.1% increase or about a dollar per person overall. Additionally, the Village was able to use State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds Program funding, a part of the American Rescue Plan, to upgrade and replace our water meter system within the Village. This funding helped us avoid property tax increases on our residents to pay for the needed system. I'm proud of the efforts of our staff and Village Board to work through trying times and still improve village services for our residents.

Finally, it continues to be my pleasure to represent the people of Hanover Park. We cannot do it without you! Take time to volunteer and give back to our wonderful community, at the schools, churches or assisting on the playing field. We are a Village that believes all youth are capable of success, No Exceptions! Together we are finding ways to make a difference in our hometown of Hanover Park!

Special Events & Block Party Applications!

Are you planning on holding a special event or block party? If so, it is important to note that an application must be submitted to the Village Clerk's Office in order to do so. Read below to find out which application is needed?

- Block Parties are for Hanover Park residents who live on a residential street and wish to have a party with their neighbors. Street closures would need to be approved. All applications for a Block Party should be submitted to the Clerks office at least 30-days prior to the event.
- Special Event applications are needed when businesses in Hanover Park would like to promote their business through sidewalk sales, live entertainment, festivals, and more. These events require a Village Permit and the application must be submitted at least 60-days prior to the event. The fee for each special event permit is \$35.00.

New Police Chief Andy Johnson Sworn In

The Village of Hanover Park has announced the appointment of Deputy Chief Andrew Johnson to the position of Chief of Police, effective May 7th. Deputy Chief Johnson will replace Chief Michael Menough, who is retiring after a 26-year career with the Village. Deputy Chief Johnson began his career with the Police Department on July 12, 1999 and has worked in a

variety of roles since then, including patrol officer, Special Operations Group officer, detective, patrol sergeant, lieutenant, and as deputy chief of both the Support Services and Operations Divisions.

Deputy Chief Johnson played an active role in the development of several key police department programs, including the Area Response Team (ART) Program and the department's community outreach initiative, Police and Citizens Connected. He holds a master's degree in criminal justice administration from Columbia College (MO) and is a graduate of Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command. He is also the current chair of the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police Public Relations Committee. Deputy Chief Johnson will be sworn in at the Village Board Meeting on Thursday, May 5th.



Chief of Police Michael Menough to Retire

Chief of Police Michael Menough has announced his retirement from the Village of Hanover Park effective May 6, 2022. Chief Menough began his career with the Village of Hanover Park on November 20, 1995, and rose through the ranks to the chief of police position, which he has held since 2016. During his tenure as chief of police, the department focused on maintaining a low crime rate and expanding community policing and outreach strategies. In 2021, Hanover Park experienced the lowest Part I crime total in Village history, continuing a trend of low crime that has persisted over the past several years.



In terms of community outreach, the department made significant strides under Chief Menough to seek new ways to engage and partner with residents and stakeholders. The department began its participation in the annual holiday Shop with a Cop event in which underprivileged children are taken holiday shopping by police officers, and participated in the Cop on a Rooftop event at local businesses to raise money for Special Olympics Illinois. Additionally, the department began holding resident meetings in Spanish on a quarterly basis. Chief Menough also worked to foster a culture of transparency during his tenure by establishing a 'Transparency Portal' on the police department website capturing data on police officer use of force, internal investigations, traffic stops, and other relevant information. The department is also in the process of implementing body worn cameras for officers, which will commence later this year.

During Chief Menough's tenure, the department faced significant and historic challenges, including the COVID-19 pandemic and the period of civil unrest experienced around the country during 2020. "The department weathered these challenges as a result of its professionalism and adherence to the professional standards established by the Commission on the Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA)," said Chief Menough. "Despite the rise in crime in many metropolitan areas around the country, Hanover Park has maintained a low crime rate and I am extremely proud of our effort to keep the community safe. It has been my pleasure to serve this community for over 26 years and to have had the opportunity to lead such an outstanding police department."

Curb Appeal Program Reminders!

Finally, winter is over! Many residents are planning outdoor activities and are addressing routine outdoor maintenance issues. Code Enforcement Officers will soon be in your neighborhood identifying issues that you may be planning to address.



As part of the Curb Appeal Program, when an officer observes a violation, they will typically notify the resident with a door hanger. The Officer will follow-up with a written notice of the violation to homeowner. Notices are not tickets, they are designed to identify what needs to be addressed within a specific time frame. If a homeowner needs more time to address an issue, they can contact the Code Enforcement Unit and speak with the case officer.

The following are some common items requiring correction:

- Tall grass and weeds over eight inches in height.
- Garbage and recycling containers improperly stored in front of the home.
- Driveways in serious disrepair.
- Missing or torn window screens.
- Rotted wood or peeling paint on the exterior.
- Fences that are in disrepair.
- Gutters and downspouts in disrepair.
- Inoperable vehicles stored in driveways
- Bare grass and ruts in lawn
- Dead or dangerous trees on the property.

Changes to Your Monthly Infrastructure Service Charge on Your Water Bill

Effective January 1, 2022, the Hanover Park Village Board approved an increase to the monthly infrastructure service charge from \$12.50 to \$18.50. The monthly service charge is used to fund needed water infrastructure projects. It should be noted that there was no increase in the water and sewer rate for the seventh year in a row. The increase in the monthly service charge will help replace an aged water and sewer infrastructure. In the Village's 2022 budget, there is 3.8 million dollars allocated for water main replacement with a total price tag of 30 million dollars estimated over the next 6 years. Throughout the year, the Village Board will be evaluating the viability of a bond issue, state and federal grants, and/or other options to generate revenue to help offset the cost to complete these projects.

Some residents may be eligible to receive the discount rate of \$6.25 for the Infrastructure Service Charge. See our Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) below.

Who is Eligible for the Service Charge Discount?

- Residents age 65 or older; or
- Residents enrolled in the Illinois Benefit Access Program; or
- Residents who qualify as low income by a uniform criteria by the Township that services the residential unit can apply for a reduced service charge of \$6.25 per each one-month billing period.

How Do I Apply for the Discount if I am a Senior?

Please bring your government issued photo ID with your current address and date of birth to the Finance/ Water Billing Department during normal business hours and fill out the application. You may also email the Water Billing department at waterbilling@hphil.org a completed Senior Discount Application Form along with a copy of your government issued photo ID with your current address and date of birth. To be eligible for the discounted rate, you must be listed as the customer on the water bill for the residence. Once you start receiving the discount, you do not need to reapply.

How Do I Apply for the Discount if I am a Member of the Illinois Benefit Access Program?

Please contact the Public Works Department during regular business hours at 630-823-5700 for information. You will be required to fill out an application, present your social security card and a government issued photo ID. Must be renewed every 2 years. If your application is approved, you will receive the discounted rate as well as a discounted rate on your garbage service.

How Do I Apply for Low Income Certification in order to receive the discount?

The Village of Hanover Park offers a discounted water infrastructure service charge of \$6.25 per month for low-income residents. In order for residents to qualify as low-income, they must provide a certification letter from one of the following programs: LIHEAP, LIHWAP, CEDA, IDHS SNAP, or WIC, or other similar approved program. The Village of Hanover Park is collaborating with the Townships that service

Hanover Park to help residents apply for these programs. Certification letters should be dropped off at the Water Billing Department at Village Hall, or emailed to waterbilling@hphil.org.

The discount for the service charge for a low-income resident of the Village of Hanover Park is limited in its capacity and scope and is guided by the following:

- The Discount for monthly service charge is for Hanover Park residents only.
- Residents must meet LIHEAP, or other similar approved program, guidelines as a low-income household.
- The Hanover Park resident requesting assistance must be specifically listed on the water utility bill (including renters if their name is on the water bill account) to receive the discount.
- The discounted rate is \$6.25 per month and will expire on March 2nd of each year, regardless of when the original certification was submitted.
- The discount must be renewed every year and the notice of the resident still meeting the guidelines must be sent to the Village of Hanover Park Water Billing Department on or before March 21st of each year to be effective April 1st. Residents can submit for the discount at any point during the year, but the qualification of the resident meeting LIHEAP or other approved program guidelines must be presented to the Water Billing Department on or before the 21st of the month to be valid on the following month's bill.

Referrals for Basic Needs Assistance

Hanover Park in the 90s

Who would have thought back in 1960, when Hanover Park's population was only 451 people, that the end of the 1990s would see Hanover Park grow to a population of 38,278? And with the expansion of the Internet and the expansion of thoroughfares, this population was connected to other communities like never before.

The Elgin-O'Hare Expressway opened in November 1993, and a new Metra station was opened in 1995. In 1992, the entirety of the village was linked together when Barrington and County Farm Roads were connected via an underpass under the Metra tracks. The Hanover Park branch of Poplar Creek Public Library opened in 1991 to better meet the needs of Hanover Park residents. The branch was later renamed after Sonya Crawshaw, who served as Village President for seven years in the 1990s. In 1992, Hanover Park became a Sister City with Cape Coast, Ghana, further connecting Hanover Park globally.

Grilling and Fire Pit Safety

Spring and Summer seasons are here and it's time to enjoy grilling and fire pits. The Hanover Park Fire Department is sharing safety tips to help you enjoy your barbecue and fire pit without incident. Before you fire up the grill, be sure that you are taking the proper precautions to keep you and your family safe.

- Inspect your propane tank each spring before using it. Check the gas line for leaks by applying a soap and water solution, which will bubble if there is a leak. Turn off the gas tank if a leak is detected and have your grill repaired. If the leak does not stop or if your grill develops a leak while cooking call 9-1-1 and stay away from the grill.
- It's best to keep your grill surface clean, as grease can cause flames to become unmanageable.
- Never use a grill inside. While small table-top grills are increasing in popularity, even these should not be used indoors. Besides the risk of fire, the smoke from the grill can be toxic, and it is best to grill in a well-ventilated area.
- Place your grill outside of foot traffic and at least 10-feet away from your home. Be sure that it is on a level surface, and if your grill has wheels, be sure that they are locked into place. The area should also be clear of overhanging branches.

General safety tips for recreational fires and fire pits include the following:

- Never use a flammable liquid/accelerant to start a fire and never add a flammable liquid or accelerant to a fire.
- Wind speed and direction can affect how easy it is to contain the flame within your fire pit. Also, if there is the threat of a drought, it is not advised to have an open flame on your property. Your neighborhood may have additional regulations during droughts.
- Like a grill, a fire pit should be placed a safe distance away from your home, at least 10 to 15 feet away. Unlike a grill, the open flame of a fire pit and its close proximity to the ground means that it should only be placed on fire-proof surfaces, such as slate or stone.
- In case your fire spreads, keep a garden hose or a bucket of sand nearby. These can help douse the fire if you do not have a portable fire extinguisher available.

Preparedness Pointers:



It's officially Tornado Season and its time to prepare for severe weather. Here are some Preparedness Pointers on what to do when severe weather occurs.

WHAT TO DO WHEN THE SIRENS GO OFF

Move into an interior location within a building or basement without windows. If in a vehicle, find the nearest building to seek shelter. Keep a cell phone on you and search information from the National Weather Service on storm track, timing, hazards, and information on an All Clear.

HAVE MULTIPLE WAYS OF NOTIFICATION

The primary method of receiving severe weather alerts should be through TV, Weather Radio, cell phone or social media. The National Weather Service sends out WEA alerts (Wireless Emergency Alerts) to all cell phones within the Warning location. Cellphone users should ensure their cell phones are WEA enabled to receive these alerts.

WHO SOUNDS THE SIRENS?

DuComm, the 911 Dispatch center for DuPage County, receives notification from the National Weather Service and will activate the sirens, not individual villages.

Village Tree Planting

The Village's reforestation efforts will continue in 2022. The Forestry Division of Public Works has scheduled a fall planting of approximately 80 parkway trees for this season to pursue our goal of replacing trees that have died or needed to be removed.

Several different species of trees will be included to continue the Village's efforts in creating a more biologically diverse urban forest. Biological genetic diversity is important so that future blights and invasive insects will have less of a chance of creating significant gaps in the treescape of the Village. The trees will generally be replaced on a "first removed/first replaced" basis.

Need Wood Chips?

Did you know that the Village offers free wood chips for residents and that delivery is free?

Wood Chips are not the same as mulch. The chips will vary in size, color, and composition. Each load could include leaves, evergreen needles, and various chip sizes. The chips cannot be returned once they are delivered. For this reason, we recommend that a resident requesting a delivery of chips personally look at the chips that are available at the Public Works site before placing an order. The pile of chips are located through the Village's main entrance behind the wooden fence with a sign directing residents to the location. Viewing of the chips is limited to daylight hours only.

Each resident can request two loads of wood chips at a time. Each load is approximately four cubic yards and will fill an area that is 6 ft. x 6 ft. and 3 ft. high.

Deliveries will be made at a time determined by the Forestry Supervisor. The delivery schedules will depend on weather, emergencies, and the availability of staff and equipment. They will be handled on a "first-call, first-serve" basis and will be made within three (3) weeks of the request.

Chips will be placed on driveways only, not driveway aprons, sidewalks or on the lawn. When placing your order, please let the Public Works Department know how many loads will be needed and if the crew can place the chips behind a car that could be in the driveway.

2022 Construction Season

The Village will be working on various projects to improve the infrastructure during this year's construction season. This year's project scope is one of the largest in the Village's history. Projects will vary between 2 miles of water main replacement, roadway reconstruction, 12 miles of roadway resurfacing, ADA sidewalk improvements, curb and gutter repairs, pavement surface patching, and various drainage improvements. The construction season will consist of several projects at various locations throughout the Village.


Projects will be funded through Motor Fuel Tax (MFT), Local Funds, and various grants from the State of Illinois.

Construction is a vital part of our economy and community, making these projects very important to the Village. The safety of our residents, staff, and workers is also critical. With 2022 construction season beginning, residents are reminded to be more vigilant and follow the safety tips below:

- Do not use your cell phone while driving. Drop it and drive.
- Slow down and obey speed limits.
- If possible, move over for workers and obey flagger's directions.
- Pay attention to construction signs and field conditions as conditions change quickly.
- Use and follow detour signs.
- Give heavy vehicles room to adjust to conditions.
- Remember: Traffic backups can occur at any time.
